

We closed our club portion of the Lodge to just open for food and drinks on Wed. and Friday but due to lack of support, we cannot continue. The cost of keeping the Lodge open is more per month than we bring in during the month. Therefore it puts us in the red and this cannot continue. The last bingo will be Nov. 24th.

The support of our members is no longer there. We don't have members supporting the Lodge by chairing committees, supporting our required programs, filling officer chairs nor supporting the Club end. We struggle to get 9 in attendance for our monthly meetings, so the few that are dedicated to trying to keep us afloat fight a very hard battle.

A member suggested we raise the dues to \$200.00, but that suggestion was voted down several times in the past, even when we had 4 or 5 hundred members. And with the economy and country the way it is who can afford it

Therefore the Trustees and Officers of the Lodge have decided to close the Lodge due to extreme financial difficulties and lack of support. Meetings will still be held there on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month until we find another place to hold them. This coming month of December the only meeting will be held on December 10 at 7 PM. There will not be one on the 4th Tuesday as that is Christmas Eve.
