Dr. Goldie Cornelieuson and Elba Moore, a nurse supervisor, traveled throughout the Upper Peninsula to care for undernourished and malnourished children because of the Depression. They held classes for mothers on nutrition and children's health. They had a dream of a place where they could provide children with three healthy meals a day in the fresh air and sun. In 1933,

Dr Cournelieuson remembered a farm that was for sale in Big Bay. It was an empty farm with big buildings, an apple orchard, lots of green grass and fresh air near Lake Superior. It was not long before through the generosity of donations, they purchased the 170 acre farm. With the economy beginning to get better they still had many concerns about the health of children, particularly after an outbreak of polio in 1940. And so the camp became a place for those recuperating from polio to learn, receive care and learn to walk again. Caring for children through concern for their health, wellness and nutrition would always be the center of care at Bay Cliff and now the women added therapy and rehabilitation. Bay Cliff became a place for children with diabetes, cardiac difficulties, speech and hearing disabilities and occupational difficulties to go to receive care and therapy. It also became a place for them to have fun. Bay Cliff is staffed by passionate individuals who continue the emphasis on assisting children with special needs do the things all children like to do – from riding bikes to playing baseball and attending a Prom! Bay Cliff's mission statement says it all, *"Bay Cliff is a place apart...where children and adults with physical disabilities learn to believe in themselves, strive for fuller lives, and realize their dreams."* In less than 109 days the kids will arrive at Bay Cliff for the summer!
